Family: Asteraceae

Origin: California Channel Islands

Climate Zone: USDA 5-10, Sunset 1-24

Mature Height: 1 to 2 feet with flower stalk

Mature Width: 3-4 feet

Plant Type: Semi-evergreen

Growth Habit: Vigorous, upright

Growth Rate: Fast

Flower Color/Details: White, pink or rose red, varies by plant, fragrant flat topped panicles

Flower Season: Spring, summer, fall

Foliage: Bright green narrow fern like leaves, usually finely divided, toothed edges

Use: Borders, filler, containers, native meadow, lawn substitute, rain, bird, and rock gardens

Floral: Use as cut flowers, dried in winter arrangements

Wildlife/Beneficials: Attracts many beneficial insects, important nectar source for butterflies and native bees

Water Requirements: Low, drought tolerant, tolerates seasonal flooding

Description: Plants are low and spreading by underground runners. Tolerates foot traffic. Good companion plant, compost additive, used to control erosion, improve soils, excellent habitat plant.

Maintenance: Remove dead flowers for repeat bloom. Divide clumps every two years or thin annually by lifting and cutting out running stems.
